Dear Parishioners,

Happy Easter! I hope that today is one filled with joy in the risen Lord who has unlocked heaven for us and given us the hope of eternal life. I hope, as well, that you have the opportunity to celebrate this great feast day of the Resurrection with loved ones. I am looking forward to visiting with my family in Tiffin later today.



As Lent has concluded and the Easter season begins, it reminds me of something that St. Augustine said. He mentioned that the season of Lent corresponds to our lives on this earth which are filled with trials and difficulties while the Easter season points toward what life will be like in heaven. In heaven, the suffering and pain of this life will cease. There will then be only glory, joy, and peace beyond anything we could ever imagine. This life of glory is what we are made for and knowing that this is our end goal gives us hope in the midst of our trials.

While the discipline of Lent was around 40 days, our joy and celebration of the Easter season will be for 50 days concluding with Pentecost on May 24. Beginning today and continuing through next Sunday, these next eight days are known as the Octave of Easter where each day is considered to be a continuation of Easter Sunday. The Mass prayers during these eight days even mention the Resurrection as happening “today.” Jesus rising from the dead is such an amazing event that the Church celebrates it for eight days in a row (and dedicates a whole season to reflecting on it).

Next Sunday, (the Octave Day of Easter), is one of my favorite feast days: Divine Mercy Sunday. It is a celebration of God’s profound love for us and of His great mercy offered to us, no matter what we have done. We will celebrate this solemnity with confessions and a special Holy Hour with the sung Divine Mercy Chaplet and sung Evening Prayer. There is also a plenary indulgence available for those who participate in Divine Mercy devotions next Sunday. Please see page 5 of the bulletin for more information. I hope that you are able to make it for this special celebration of God’s mercy.

This past week, it was nice to be able to celebrate some special liturgies at the Cathedral. Bishop Thomas blessed the Oil of the Sick and Oil of Catechumens and consecrated the Sacred Chrism at the Chrism Mass on Tuesday. He also gave a good homily that invited us to embrace the cross like St. Francis of Assisi (whose Jubilee Year we celebrate in 2026). I appreciate Brandon Barlage from Holy Family and Carl and Marge Brown and Sarah Long from St. Nicholas who were our parish representatives who attended this Mass and brought back the holy oils to each parish. I saw some of our other parishioners were there on Tuesday as well. Our parishes were also represented at the special Tenebrae service on Wednesday of Holy Week which went well. My parents and one of my sisters were also able to make it. Afterward, Bishop Thomas greeted me and told me, “Please send my love to your parishioners.”


As we celebrate this Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord, may we be filled with great joy in Jesus’ victory over death and great hope for the amazing things that await us in eternal life, knowing that “eye has not seen, and ear has not heard...what God has prepared for those who love him” (1 Corinthians 2:9, NABRE).

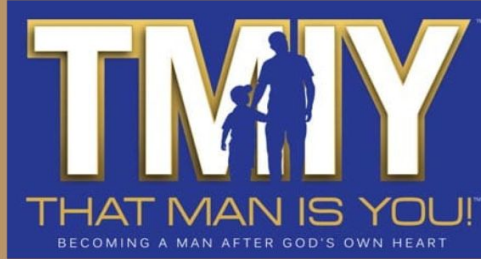

**THE DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY INDULGENCE** can be obtained by participating in Divine Mercy Sunday devotions in a church while completing the other usual requirements for indulgences (which include going to Confession, receiving the Eucharist worthily, praying for the intentions of

the Holy Father (for example, with an Our Father and a Hail Mary), and being detached from sin). Ideally, going to Confession and receiving the Eucharist take place on Divine Mercy Sunday itself, but the Church allows them to take place within 20 days before or after the actual day. An indulgence is the forgiveness of the punishment due to our sins which can be full forgiveness ("plenary") or partial. It can be applied to oneself or to someone deceased.
