Dear Parishioners,

What a wonderful celebration that we had for First Communion last Sunday. Thirty-two of our 2nd Graders received Jesus in the Eucharist for the very first time. Thanks so much to our Coordinator of Religious Education and 2nd Grade Catechist, Cherie Compton, for walking with these students during this school year and preparing them for this special sacrament. Thanks also to the parents, godparents, and grandparents of our First Communicants and to all those who have helped pass on the Catholic faith to these children. Thanks, as well, to those who had a part to play in this special liturgy including Deacon Doyle, our sacristan, Marlene Schroeder, our combined St. Nicholas and Holy Family choir and musicians, servers, and all liturgical ministers. Your help was greatly appreciated. May uniting themselves with the Lord in Holy Communion lead our First Communicants to a deep, life-long, and intimate relationship with Christ, and may all of us always appreciate the miraculous gift that Jesus has left us in this sacrament.



Today in the Church, we celebrate World Day of Prayer for Vocations. It is a day that corresponds with the 4th Sunday of Easter every year (known as Good Shepherd Sunday) and is a reminder to pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life. Here in our parishes, we are blessed to have our former CRE for both parishes and a daughter of Holy Family Parish, Sister Grace, currently in formation for the Carmelite Sisters of the Most Sacred Heart of Los Angeles. I received a letter from her after Christmas time earlier this year, and she asked that I share with our parishes her deep gratitude for your thoughts and prayers. It means a lot to her, and she feels that these prayers are sustaining her in her journey.

Sister Grace is currently in her first year of being a novice. God willing, she will make her first profession of vows and receive the full Carmelite habit in the summer of 2027. It was also exciting that a former member of my Putnam County Discernment Group, Quinton Schnipke from Ottoville, was recently accepted as a seminarian for the Diocese of Toledo. He will begin this fall with his first year of seminary (known as the propaedeutic year) at Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit with a year focused especially on prayer, the spiritual life, and human formation rather than on just classes. The prayers for vocations are definitely working (we have 6 new seminarians for the Diocese of Toledo accepted for next year with a few more still applying). Please keep those in formation, especially Sister Grace and our Toledo seminarians, in your prayers.

I am looking forward to our Damascus Summer Camp Donation Dinner this evening. It is a great opportunity to support our youth in this powerful camp experience that has borne so much fruit in our parishes. We have around 75 of our youth who plan to attend the Damascus Summer Camp this year, and funds raised at this dinner will go toward the subsidy that the parishes offer those who request it.

Also, next Sunday will be the celebration of May Crowning at the 8:30 am and 10:30 am Masses. Our 2nd Graders will be invited to wear their First Communion attire and to crown the statue of Mary as the month of May is especially dedicated to honoring her. After those two Masses, we will also celebrate the blessing of religious articles (those of our First Communicants, of our newly confirmed, and of all those who would like articles blessed). If you have any religious articles that you would like blessed (such as rosaries, statues, medals, crucifixes, religious artwork, etc.), please place those articles on the table near the statue of St. Joseph before Mass begins. After the recessional hymn, I will come back into the church and celebrate the rite of blessing.

On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations, may the Lord bless all of those in formation for the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life, and may we remember to pray for an increase in vocations, that there may be many laborers for the abundant harvest of eternal life.

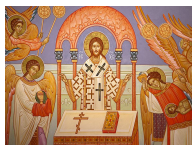

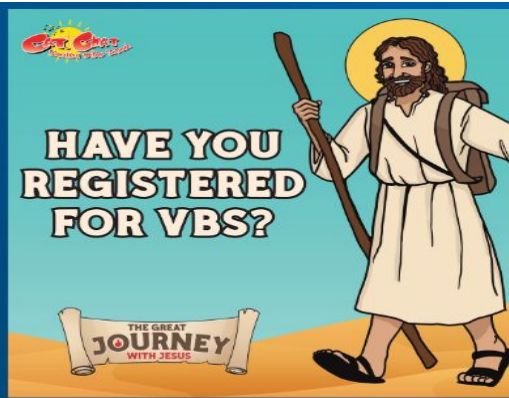


