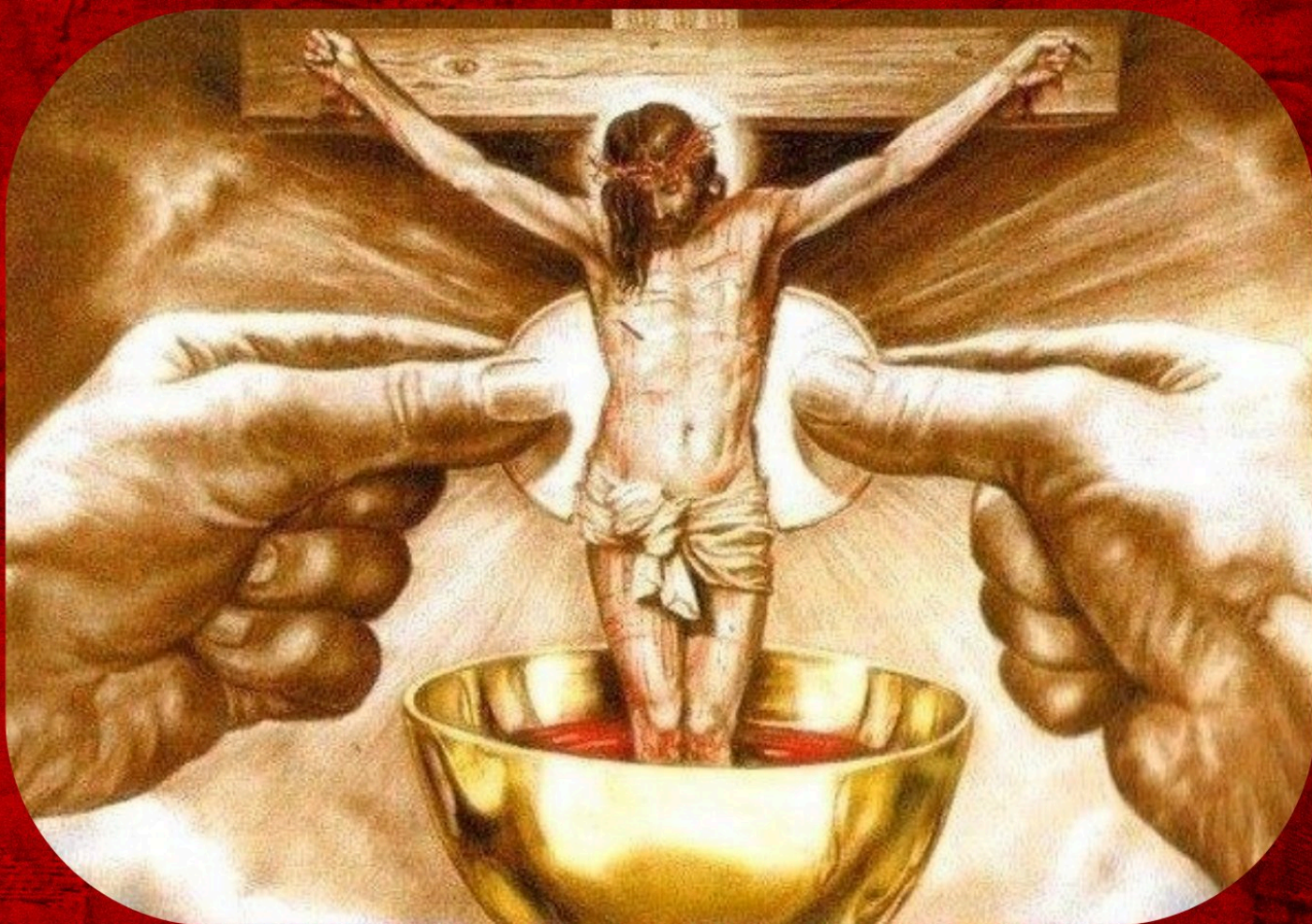

May 31, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

As I am away this weekend for my brother's wedding, we are blessed to welcome Fr. Farrell "Mac" McLaughlin to our parishes on behalf of Cross Catholic Outreach. I appreciate Fr. McLaughlin being here to celebrate our Lord's Day Masses and to share about the important work being done by the Church for the poor in different parts of the world. May his visit with us be blessed, and may it be a help both spiritually and financially to the missionary work of Cross Catholic Outreach.



Next week on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, we will have the commissioning of our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion at each of the Lord's Day Masses and also a Eucharistic procession following the 8:30 am Mass. After the procession and benediction, there will be a brunch in the Holy Family Parish Hall (church basement) which will also be a party for Deacon Doyle's 20th anniversary of ordination. I am looking forward to celebrating the great gift of the Eucharist on this special feast day in the Church and to celebrating with Deacon Doyle on this milestone in his ministry.

Also, you may have heard, last Monday (May 25), Pope Leo XIV released his first encyclical entitled *Magnifica Humanitas* (Magnificent Humanity). A papal encyclical is a circular letter written by a pope which often touches upon matters of faith and morals. (Actually, in apostolic times, letters were often used for teaching and exhortation and today, they make up a significant part of the New Testament). Pope Leo wrote this recent encyclical on the importance of upholding human dignity in an age of technological revolution and of growth in the use of artificial intelligence.

So far, I have had the chance to read the introduction and first three chapters (of the five total chapters) of *Magnifica Humanitas*. I have very much enjoyed it so far. Pope Leo mentions that our current situation with technology presents us with two options: to pursue the Tower of Babel from Genesis 11:1-9 or the rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem from Nehemiah 2-6. With the Tower of Babel, the people were motivated by "pride and the claim to self-sufficiency" (*Magnifica Humanitas*, n. 7). They created the tower as a way to rival God rather than as a way to glorify Him or grow closer to Him. In the Book of Nehemiah, it is the opposite; the people work together in a fraternal and communal spirit and do all for God's glory. Pope Leo invites us to "abandon the construction of yet another Tower of Babel" in our present age and "to join forces in building up the common good" (n. 16).

Pope Leo XIV follows very much in line with his predecessor, Pope Leo XIII, who signed his famous encyclical, *Rerum Novarum* (Of New Things) on May 15, 1891 (135 years to the day before Pope Leo XIV signed his encyclical). *Rerum Novarum* dealt with the "new things" of that time frame which included industrialization and the need to respect the dignity of workers. It also laid the groundwork for what is known as Catholic Social Teaching (CST). Catholic Social Teaching is based on the truth of our faith that all human life is created in the image and likeness of God, and because of this truth, we have such dignity that must be respected. Out of this truth flows the CST principles of the common good, the universal destination of goods (i.e. the resources of this earth are meant for everyone), subsidiarity (i.e. higher authority should respect the responsibility/role of lower authority), solidarity (i.e. we are one human family and have the duty to look out and care for our brothers and sisters), and social justice. Pope Leo XIV describes these principles and also mentions how they apply today to technology (for example, with the universal destination of goods, all of earth's resources, including digital resources, are meant to be shared by humanity. To be avoided, as Pope Leo sites from a homily by St. John Paul II, is the hoarding of resources by a select few (n. 65)).

Pope Leo XIV impressively quotes and synthesizes the teachings of many of his predecessors including Pope Francis, Pope Benedict XVI, Pope St. John Paul II, Pope Leo XIII, the documents of the Second Vatican Council, and others. He stands firmly in the tradition of the Church and simply applies these principles to the situation that we find ourselves in today. To summarize a main point that he makes, technology should serve the human person and not the other way around. We have such dignity that must always be respected and our purpose on this earth (as the Baltimore Catechism says) is to know, love, and serve God in this life so as to be happy with Him forever in the next life. If technology is treated as an end in itself or is used to disrespect human dignity, we repeat the sad mistake from Genesis of the Tower of Babel.

I look forward to reading the rest of *Magnifica Humanitas*. There is a lot of content, and it is a lot to take in, but as a loving shepherd, Pope Leo desires to help guide humanity toward a healthy relationship with AI and technology use today so as to help lead us to heaven. It is my hope that Pope Leo's words will be taken to heart by many people, including those who design technology and social media, make decisions related to AI use in the workplace, government officials called to regulate these technologies, and by all.

May the Lord continue to bless the ministry of Pope Leo XIV and guide Him with the Holy Spirit, that he may continue to be a wise, faithful, and prudent shepherd that the Lord has called him to be.

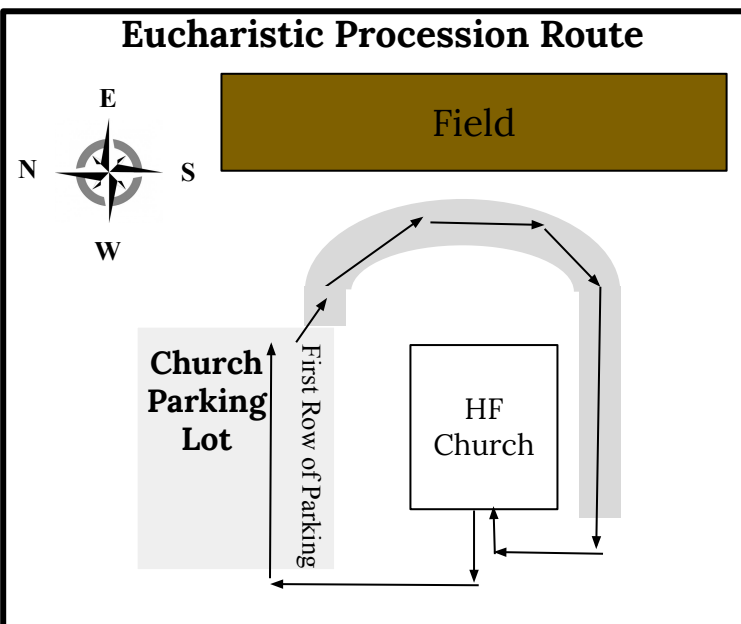
