Dear Parishioners,

Today is the celebration of Catechetical Sunday in the Church in the United States. It is celebrated on the third Sunday of September every year and acknowledges the importance of the Church's teaching ministry. It also provides an opportunity to honor those who fulfill the important role of catechist. I am so grateful to our many dedicated catechists who pass on the faith to our youth through religion classes and Sunday school. I am also grateful for our many adult mentors who take the time to walk with our high school youth in their journey of faith. We likewise have the core teams of our men's and women's groups (That Man Is You and She Shall Be Called Woman) and the Giving Team for our Women's Welcome Retreat that also hand on the faith to their brothers and sisters in Christ. (I enjoyed attending the first meetings of TMIY and SHE recently and stopping by a Women's Welcome Giving Team planning meeting). There are also the three host couples for our marriage enrichment small groups with the program Together in Holiness that I am grateful for as well. Kira and Moriah also hand on the faith through their before-school Tuesday morning Bible Study for high school students (which begins on September 29) and through Moriah's ongoing young adult Bible Study.



By virtue of our baptism, all of us are called to hand on the faith in some way and to witness to the Gospel. Parents themselves have a primary role in passing on the faith to their children. They are the first teachers of their children in everything including in the faith. It is a great responsibility but also a great joy to hand on the truths and teachings that lead to eternal life. Overall, what a great reminder today is to make sure that we all seek to hand on the faith to others.

I very much enjoyed the Leadership Conference that I attended back on September 9-10 in Toledo. Seven priests of our diocese were part of a small cohort who were trained by Assumption Holy Trinity parishioner Steve Gfell. The training provided affirmation of our leadership strengths and identified areas for continued growth. I am excited to put into practice things that I have learned, and I am grateful that Bishop Thomas invited me to participate in this process. As a follow up, each of us will have five individual leadership coaching sessions with Steve and a group gathering in April to cap off the year.

Speaking of conferences, please keep our Parish Staff in your prayers on Thursday. We will be attending the Diocesan Pastoral Conference that day. The theme this year is promoting vocations. The speaker will be Rhonda Gruenewald, the same speaker that we had at our priest convocation back in June. She does great work, and dioceses that have implemented her ideas have seen sustained growth in their number of seminarians. Actually, I think a big reason that we have already seen a spike in the number of seminarians here is that we have already implemented some of her ideas the past couple of years.

Next Sunday (September 27), we will be having another potluck lunch at St. Nicholas after the 10:30 am Mass. I hope that many can make it! There is a QR code on page 6 of the bulletin to sign up. It should be a nice time to build community and to enjoy socializing with one another.

Finally, if you see Deacon Doyle, be sure to wish him a happy birthday. Today, September 20, he turns another year older. We are blessed by his presence and ministry here in our parishes and, personally, I am very grateful for all that he does for us. May the Lord bless him with many more years of life and faithful service to our parishes.

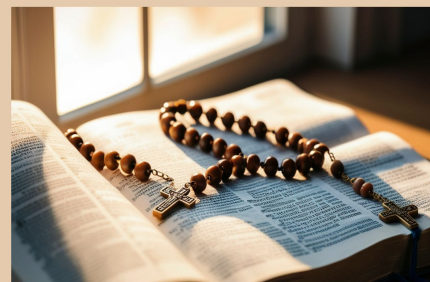

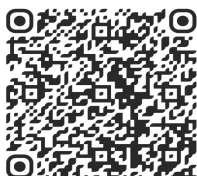

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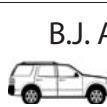
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
