Dear Parishioners,

Today is the celebration of Priesthood Sunday in the United States. It is a day dedicated to praying for priests and showing gratitude and appreciation for their ministry. It is a blessing that we will be able to mark this day with a potluck meal at St. Nicholas after the 10:30 am Mass. I am especially giving thanks to God today for the gift of my vocation. Priesthood Sunday can be a good opportunity for all of us to thank God for those many priests whose witness, ministry, and love for the Lord and His Church have helped us in our journey of faith. We can also pray for them: for perseverance in their ministry for those still living and eternal rest for those who have gone before us in faith.



Speaking of vocations, we had a wonderful Diocesan Pastoral Conference on Thursday. Parish and school staff members from around the diocese gathered in Perrysburg to learn about ways to better promote vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, consecrated life, and matrimony. It was an enriching experience. Our speaker, Rhonda Gruenewald (who also spoke at the Diocesan Priest Convocation earlier this year), shared many statistics with us related to diocesan priestly vocations. One takeaway is that in order to maintain our current level of active priests, we need to add nine new seminarians per year for the next fifteen years. While this may seem like a daunting task, we did just accept nine new seminarians for this current school year. Fr. David Kidd also shared with us that he already has three more young men applying for seminary next year. Good things are happening with vocations, and it is important to keep the momentum going. Another point made during the conference is that promoting vocations is the responsibility of every member of the Church. We are all in this together which is why Bishop Thomas has asked every Catholic in the Diocese of Toledo to pray one Hail Mary a day for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and to offer a sacrifice each Friday (such as abstaining from meat) for the same intention.

I have said this before, but I believe that we have young men and women among us at St. Nicholas and Holy Family Parishes whom the Lord may be calling to the priesthood or religious life. I have told some of them this, and it is encouraging that they are open to this calling. In thinking about their future life plans, though, it is important for all of our youth and young adults to ask the questions, "Lord, what do you want me to do with my life? Lord, how can I best serve you?"

This past Thursday was also the beatification of Fulton Sheen in St. Louis, Missouri (beatification is the last step before someone is declared a canonized saint). It was such a well-attended Mass (I heard that the entrance procession with the many seminarians and clergy present took about an hour!). Blessed Fulton Sheen was born in Peoria, Illinois and was a brilliant bishop, speaker, author, and television personality in the 20th century. At our diocesan conference, it was mentioned how Bl. Fulton Sheen once won an Emmy which he was awarded in 1952, even over famous stars like Lucille Ball. As he accepted the award, he said, "I would like to thank my writers....Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John." Bl. Fulton was such a gift to the Church, and perhaps someday will be canonized a saint.

Finally, just a reminder that the deadline to apply for the Youth and Young Adult Minister position in our parishes is tomorrow (Monday, September 28). Please keep this job search in your prayers that the Lord may lead us to the person that God is calling to serve our parishes through this position.

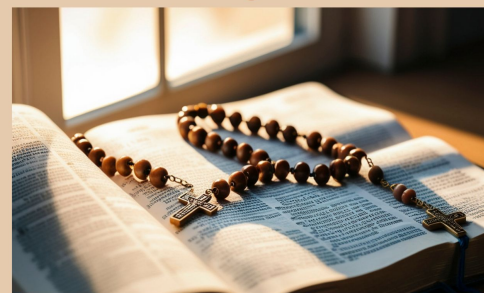


Damascus Summer Camp

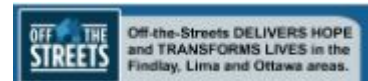
